Enlarge these terms, cut them out and paste each one onto cardboard. Randomly distribute one to each student. Instruct your students to walk around the room and match their term or definition. When students have matched their pair, check with the teacher and then go to the side of the room. Review answers as a class. This can be used as a review of terms or a formative assessment to check understanding of terms and concepts from the learning sequences.

Victoria	British Queen of the Swan River colony from 1837 to 1901.
James Stirling	The first Governor of the Swan River Colony
Charles Prinsep	Began horse breeding industry in WA
Wool	Top export from WA until the 1890s
British Colonies	Canada, India and New Zealand
Broome	Centre for the pearl shell industry
Coolgardie	Start of gold discovery in the 1890s
Jarrah	Called Swan River Mahogany
Fraternity	Sharing similar interests or brotherhood
Albany	The earliest European town colonised in Western Australia
Terra Nullius	Land belonging to nobody, enabled Britain to claim land for the Crown (King or Queen of Great Britain)
Convicts	Requested by the Swan River Colony to ease labour shortages
Britain	Often symbolised by a lion or Britannia
British navy and merchant shipping	Enabled the defence of the British Empire and rich trade across the world
Commonwealth	A later name used for the British Empire
